Grants

The European Commission, through its Directorate-General for Health & Consumers (DG SANCO), awards grants to help implement projects or activities related to European Union policies.

The grant beneficiaries are mainly private or public organisations, chosen by the European Commission for their capacity to implement the projects concerned.

Grants are subject to annual programming. Before 31 March each year, the Commission publishes the annual work programmes in the field of health and consumer policies. It fixes the broad outlines of the grants envisaged over the year such as the area of activity, objectives, timetable, available budget and award conditions. From these work programmes you can already identify the fields which interest you.

Calls for proposals are then published on our Internet sites. Candidates have a set deadline to present a proposal which corresponds to the objectives and fulfils the required conditions. Candidates are informed individually of the final decision concerning their proposal.

The Commission delegated to the Executive Agency for Health and Consumers the responsibility for implementing the Public Health Programme, the Consumer Programme and the Food Safety Training Measures. For further information, please see the corresponding websites:

Youth in Action Programme

Sub-action 1.2: Youth Initiative

Project entirely devised, planned and implemented by young people (18-30 year olds).

It aims at stimulating young people's creativity, enterprise and initiative.

Two types of initiatives: National Youth Initiative and Transnational Youth Initiative

Topic? Art and culture, social exclusion, homelessness and unemployment, leisure, and media and communications, etc

Where to apply? National Agency





Action 2: European Voluntary Service

It enables young people (18-30 years old) to carry out voluntary service for up to 12 months in a country other than their country of residence.

Example:

- "Youth centre" in Austria: co-organisation of cultural and social events, workshop, leisure activities.
- "Biodynamic Farm" in the Netherlands: assistance on dairy production, ornamental garden and sales activities.

To receive accreditation, organisations submit an "expression of interest".

Accreditation is carried out by Executive Agency, National Agency or SALTO SEE RESOURCE Centre.



DG Regional Policy

Instrument for Pre-Accession Assistance

The IPA replaces a series of European Union programmes and financial instruments for candidate countries or potential candidate countries.

The IPA is made up of five different components:

- Assistance for transition and institution building
- Cross-border cooperation
- Regional development
- Human resources
- Rural development



IPA beneficiary countries?

- EU candidate countries (**Croatia**, Turkey and the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia) are eligible for all five components of IPA.
- Potential candidate countries in the Western Balkans (Albania, **Bosnia-Herzegovina**, Montenegro, **Serbia**, and Kosovo under UN Security Council Resolution 1244/99) are eligible only for the first two components.




DG Regional Policy Call for proposals

DG Regional Policy **Structural Funds**

Objectives:

- Convergence: to accelerate the convergence of the least developed EU Member States and regions by improving growth and employment conditions
- Regional competitiveness and employment: to anticipate economic and social change, promote innovation and environmental protection
- European territorial cooperation: to reinforce cooperation at cross-border, transnational and interregional levels and foster the development of economic relations and networking between SMEs

There are two Structural Funds:

(ERDF) provides support for the creation the integration into working life of of infrastructure and productive job- unemployed and disadvantaged sections creating investment, businesses.

European Regional Development Fund European Social Fund (ESF) contributes to mainly for of the population, mainly by funding training measures.
